# Ex-Con Held on Charge Of First Degree Assault

Glenn Eugene Totterdell, 29, an ex-convict, is held in lieu of \$5,000 bail at the county jail in connection with the shooting of 39-year-old

Totterdell is charged by County Atty. R. V. Bottomly with first degree assault with a deadly weapon. He appeared before Justice John Isaacson Saturday but entered no plea. He indicated he intends to get a lawyer.

Meanwhile Brown, an employe of the Ozark Club here, remained in critical condition at Deaconess Hospital. He underwent surgery Saturday.

A .32 caliber slug, fired by Totterdell from a small revolver, struck Brown in the center of his back about three inches from his spine. The slug hit a nerve center causing Brown to be paralyzed from the waist down.

According to Acting Police Chief A. J. Coppens, Totterdell admitted shooting Brown, a Negro. In the investigation police learned that Brown had been sent by his employer, Leo LaMar Sr., 304½ 1st Ave. S., to the Totterdell home for the purpose of "returning some costume jewelry left at LaMar's place by Mrs. Totterdell."

Mrs. Totterdell told police she had worked at that address for three days. The couple reportedly came here from Boise, Idaho, two weeks ago.

A witness who said he was waiting for Brown in LaMar's car driven by Brown, told police Brown was shot as he ran from Totterdell's home. He said Brown had left the costume jewelry inside the home when he received no answer to his knock at the front door.

The witness added that Brown had started back to the car when Totterdell appeared at the door and called to him. Brown then saw the gun in Totterdell's hand, according to the witness, and started running. He was shot as he ran into First avenue south, about 75 feet from the house.

Totterdell told police he and his wife had been visiting another couple in a basement apartment at 720 1st Ave. S., just before the shooting. Mrs. Totterdell was found there by police.

Totterdell is a known criminal and an ex-convict, according to police records. A Crime Conference report made here in 1956 indicates that Totterdell is an associate of William Truman Dennis and Carl Owens, two well-known safe burglars. The trio has been operating in the Idaho, Oregon, Washington area since 1956

Richard Brown Friday night at 720 1st Ave. S. Bail was set in the Isaacson Justice Court Saturday.

Totterdell's wife, Helen, 22, jailed Saturday morning on a vagrancy charge and transferred to the county jail as a material witness in the case, was released early Saturday evening after she posted \$500 bail.

SHARJA, Trucial Oman (AP)—The red flag of the Sultan was reported flying over rebel strongholds in Oman and Muscat Saturday, and the British called off their jet fighter-bombers.

After three days of rocket-blasting at rebel held forts, RAF planes switched to dropping leaflets again telling Amanis to swing behind the pro-British Sultan and for the rebels to quit.

Throughout the British assault, the strongholds flew the white flag of the Imam of Oman, religious leader Ghalib Ben Ali who came back from Saudi Arabian exile to try to overthrow Sultan Said Bin Taimur.
